Teaching and Learning Content: Islam Beliefs

Year Group: 9 Spring 1 -Term 3



Topics:

- > The nature of Allah
- Angels
- Holy books
- Risalah
- Prophet Muhammed
- Life after death

Home Learning:

Students are expected to complete <u>one piece of home learning every week</u> as well as learning key words, facts and teachings in Knowledge Organiser <u>every week</u>.

Key Questions:

- What do Muslims believe about Allah?
- Why are Prophets important in Islam?
- Who is Prophet Muhammad and why is he important in Islam?
- What is the purpose of Angels and why are they important in Islam?
- What are Muslim beliefs about the afterlife and God's plan for our lives?
- What are the six articles of faith in Sunni Islam?
- What are the five roots of religion in Shia Islam?
- Why are Islamic Holy books important in Islam?

Students will:

- Explore Muslim understanding of God.
- Describe reasons why Prophet Muhammed is important to Muslims.
- Know key beliefs about Risalah
- Describe how the concept of Risalah has had an impact on Islam
- Explain the importance of the night of power in Islam
- · Describe the meaning of kutubs in Islam
- Explore the importance of kutub
- Evaluate significance of kutub
- Describe Muslim beliefs about the nature and role of angels
- Explain Muslim beliefs about angels

- End of unit assessment for each half term
- Retrieval activities from knowledge organisers like starter quizzes and true or false statements
- Mini whiteboard activities
- Keyword vocabulary tests

Therapy

- Sharing model responses (teacher/student led feedback)
- DIRT tasks
