Teaching and Learning Content: Photography Year Group: Year 11 Half Term 4



Externally Set Assessment – Students will have chosen their individual theme from AQA. Students will continue to work on their chosen theme, developing their project, to realise a final piece in their 10 hour exam in April.

Home Learning:

Students are expected to annotate their class work each week as a minimum and may also need to conduct additional activities such as research, taking their own photographs or other small practical tasks.

Key Questions:

- How does your artist link to your theme?
- Does your work show an understanding for the artist's work?
- What information from your research have you chosen to help you to develop your work?
- Why did you select this information? How does this reflect the assessment criteria?
- How has your choice of artist affected your choice of materials and art techniques?
- How and why did you combine materials and techniques, does this connect to your critical sources?
- Explain the connection between your critical sources and media choices
- How did you modify and personalise your work to reflect your intentions?
- Explain how this connects to your critical and visual sources?
