

Mi vida en el insti – My life at school

In this topic students will learn how to talk life at school. They will learn how to discuss their thoughts on school uniform and the school day in detail, building on what they will have learn in KS3. They will talk about the subjects they study and the teachers they have in school. They will use <u>superlatives</u> and <u>compratives</u> to give extra detail with their opinions. They will learn how to give detailed descriptions about their school and use <u>negatives</u> alongside <u>past tenses</u> to give comparisons between past and present. In addition they will be able to talk about school rules and problems in school while developing their skills in listening. They will consolidate their learn on using the *future tense* to discuss a future school exchange and finally learn how to talk about the school clubs and achievements they have experienced.

Home Learning:

Students are expected to complete <u>one piece of Spanish home learning per week</u> this will be in the form of vocabulary tests and the use of a vocabulary app to consolidate developing full sentences and short paragraphs based on the topic of learning using a range of tenses in Spanish.
