What is HAF?

HAF is a national Department for Education funded programme that enables eligible children and young people to attend free activities and experiences with free nutritional food provided. HAF activities and experiences take place in the Easter, Summer and Christmas school holidays.

HAF Objectives

There are many benefits for children who attend the HAF programme. We encourage all HAF providers to ensure a high-quality experience that will result in children:

- · Receiving healthy and nutritious meals
- · Maintaining a healthy level of physical activity
- · Being happy, having fun and meeting new friends
- . Developing a greater understanding of food, nutrition and other health related issues
- · Taking part in fun and engaging activities that support their development and well-being
- Feeling safe and secure
- · Getting access to the right support services
- . Returning to school feeling engaged and ready to learn.

Who is eligible?

Children and young people need to be school-aged children (reception to year 11 inclusive) and meet one or more of the following criteria:

- In receipt of benefits-related free school meals. The Council's website has more information on this: Coventry.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals
- Assessed (through a Children and Families assessment, undertaken by Children's Services) as a 'child in need'
- · On a child protection plan
- · A child in care
- A young carer
- · Assessed (through an early help assessment) to be in financial hardship
- · Part of the Ukrainian Family Scheme or the Home for Ukraine programme
- · Receiving Free School Meals through having No Recourse to Public Funds.

Children and young people in years 12-13 are eligible if they are in receipt of benefits-related free school meals and either have an EHCP or are receiving SEN support at their place of education.



How can schools support?

Schools are vital to the success of the HAF programme as they can help to ensure eligible families receive the information they need to participate in the programme. Key actions for schools include:

- 1) Know who your HAF eligible children are (see link HAF eligibility)
- 2) Promote HAF at the start of the school day/end of the school day
- 3) Share HAF in your weekly newsletter to parents
- 4) Keep copies of the HAF brochures at reception desks/in classrooms
- 5) Share relevant links and literature from the HAF team with eligible families.

We will empower you to set personal goals and make small but significant steps towards change.

We support young adults to build confidence, develop selfbelief and improve their mental health and wellbeing. Through one-to-one support and group activities, we focus on mental health awareness, social connection, and life skills.

Our team can assist with finding stable housing, managing finances and benefits and accessing education or employment. We also help with booking healthcare appointments and can connect individuals to other services for additional support.

We can support young adults who are

- Aged 16.5–25, who have not accessed NHS mental health interventions in the past six months;
- Aged 16.5–25, leaving care, and at risk of accessing mental health services;
- Aged 16.5–18, transitioning through pathways from children and young people's to adult mental health services.


